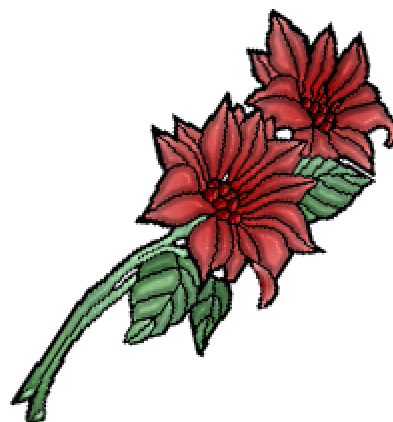



2005 New Year's Day Ride

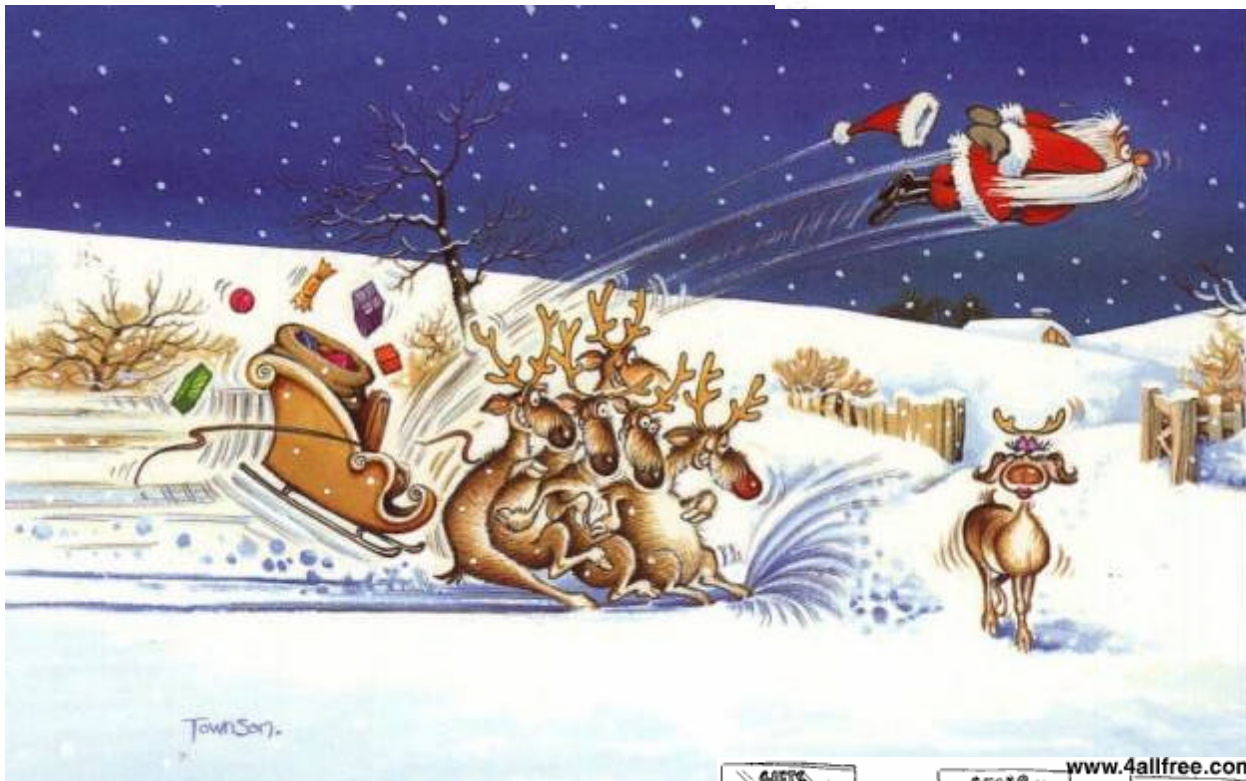
