# VERY COMFORTABLE MOTORCYCLE

Back in March 2009, my friend Ron asked me if I wanted to go to Sturgis with his brother-in-law, Art, from California. I said "Yes". Since neither Ron nor Art has been to Sturgis, Ron wanted me to be a tour guide as well. This is going to be great. Hotels rooms in Sturgis and the surrounding area were very expensive, but Art was able to secure a room in Newcastle, WY. Art arrive Monday afternoon to pick up his rented 2009 Harley-Davidson Road King and stayed at Ron's house for the night. This is going to be Art's vacation. I arrived the next morning at Ron's house to meet Art and finalize the route. Now Ron has a 2003 Yamaha V-Star 1100 ccs. I figured we would have to stop at least five times due to the fact that Ron's bike had the smallest fuel tank at 4.5 gallon to include the reserve. The frequent fuel stop would give everybody a chance for a small rest before getting back on the road. At the first stop, Art ask if I was going to fill up. I said "No. I have a 6.7 gallon tank and I'll fill up in Cheyenne, WY." Most people are surprised that the Gold Wing has such a large fuel tank since some bikes have a 5 something fuel tank to the best of my knowledge. Us as Winger can push at least 230 or 240 miles, 2 up no trailer, at least on my bike. The Wing being a heavier bike than the ones I was traveling with can handle small gust of wind with no problem.

As we got closer to Newcastle WY, the sky began to get darker but no rain. I thought that we could make it before the rain, but no such luck. As the rain came down, so did very strong gust of wind that forced several motorcycles, to include us, to pull over to the side of the road for safety. We waited approximately thirty


minutes for the rain and the wind to calm down before continuing on our way. We spent all day at Sturgis the next day and went to the Mt. Rushmore night show. The next day we went back to Mt. Rushmore to visit it in the daylight. The next place was to Crazy Horse, Needles Highway and Custer State Park. Each night was approximately one hour back to Newcastle, WY. We had to watch out for deer lining the edge of the road. Friday morning we had breakfast and headed back to Colorado Springs.

As we traveled on, my every move was scrutinized by my friends traveling behind me. For example, giving my right hand a break, bike holding steady through small gusts of wind, having a larger fuel tank, a air-dynamic fairing, lot of luggage space (especially if you are one up), radio, CD player, AM/FM, WB, AUX. CB. We don't realize that the Gold Wing is a comfortable touring machine. We have customized windshields, $\$ 800$ seats, fancy heated hand grips, floorboards, electrics, navigation systems, XM radio, etc. When we get off our machines after riding tank to tank, most of us are as fresh as when we first got on. We really don't appreciate the first-class creature comfort of the Gold Wing until we ride with other type/brand of motorcycles. Other motorcycles are excellent if you like cruisers or sport bikes, but if you want to be pampered in the lap of luxury, I believe that the Gold Wing is the motorcycle of choice.
