

Rider Education—Road Captains

The Road Captain Course is designed for all who want to participate. The person who really wants to be a group leader will benefit the most, but encourage the co-riders and riders who are not interested in being leaders to take this course. Everyone will learn something that will be useful. The co-rider can help by pointing at an object in the road so the next bike may be able to avoid that object, or give a hand signal for single file formation, etc. By taking the Road Captain course, everyone will know what to do and we will able to ride safely in a group. Below are a few subjects that will be covered in the Road Captain course.

Road Captain is the name for the rider who coordinates a multiple-bike ride. Road Captain can refer to
both the leader and the tail-gunner who, among their other duties, check that other riders are safe.
Working as part of a team, the Road Captain is responsible for the safety of the riders and the smooth
running of the ride itself. The duties of the Road Captain include planning, thinking ahead and communicating with the group. The Road Captain may even act as a tour guide.

Planning the Ride

• A Road Captain is a fundamental part of any ride planning, especially when riders may have large groups. He must know about potential hazards, road conditions and any special events that are happening at the time of the ride. A Road Captain will ride the route a few days in advance (if possible) to make sure that nothing has changed and will keep an eye on the weather.

Educating and Informing Riders

• The Road Captain is expected to brief the group before the ride. He will inform riders about the pace of the ride, tell them about staggered formation, and will explain the rules. Some rides require the participants to ride together in staggered formation, while others have a single file formation. The Road Captain will also answer questions and educate new riders in hand signals and other riding etiquette. Finally, the Road Captain will let riders know what to do should they break down or have a mishap, and might have a tactful word in the ear of a rider whose behavior is causing problems.

Leading the Ride

• The Road Captain leads the ride, working in conjunction with the tail-gunner, working around traffic and intersections to get the group through the city safely. When a lane change is performed, the leader will signal or call over the CB radio to make the change and the tail gunner initiates the move to secure the lane change. All bikes will move over when it is safe for them. Remember, you are responsible for your own safety. (Although He is used in this article, females can be Road Captains.)



We will meet at Safeway on west Colorado and 31st street at 8:15 am. Stands up at 8:30.


Breakfast will be at Costello Street Coffee House in Florissant. It is a small restaurant but they are going to set up extra tables and do everything they can to accommodate us.



Final Destination Latitude: 34° 13' 58.2414'' Longitude: _102° 24' 38.4762''

- Four teams are formed with leaders having a GPS (ONLY leaders need a GPS, so no worries if you don't have one)
- Each team is given a set of five coordinates (rather than an address) to be imputed in a GPS. The five locations are all in the Colorado Springs general area.
- Each team drives to the designated coordinate. To show proof of locating the coordinate point, a picture of the group is taken of what is on the coordinate sheet. Index card is punched at each location.



- The next set of coordinate is then put into a GPS ... and off you go again
- The ending coordinate point will be at a general location where all riders meet and eat. Winners of the 'Punch a Card' are determined.
- Approximate ride time from Start to Finish is a little over 2 hrs (87 miles).
- * Optional 'Punch a Card' - \$5 (winner for High & Low total number). 100% of all monies paid to winners.

2010 Participation Reward Program Rules

Program lasts from January 1 to December 31, 2010.

- 2 pts CPR, First Aid, ERC, or Riding Skills classes or seminars (not parking lot practices).
- 3 pts Local organized events (meeting, lunch/dinner rides, day rides, etc).
- 5 pts **Out of Area** events (other chapter meetings, events, fund raisers, etc)
- 10 pts District, Region, or National GWRRA meetings, events or rallies

Attendance for local events will be recorded from the sign-in sheets. Proof of attendance for other than Chapter I events must be provided to the Chapter within two months (60 days) of attending the event to receive credit. Proof of attendance must be something that proves of actual attendance of the event, such as signed note from meeting director, copy of sign-in sheet, or photograph at the event; gas or meal receipts are not acceptable.

Current scores to be published bi-monthly in the chapter newsletter.

Prizes to be awarded at the January 2011 Chapter meeting. Prizes will be first place \$100, second place \$50, third place \$25 if possible. Gift certificates may have to be substituted for tax reasons, determination pending.
