Summer is over, children have started back to school, and the leaves will be changing colors soon. The weather is still excellent for outdoor activities, so check your calendars and watch you emails for upcoming camping trips and motorcycle rides.

All those who went to the District Convention had a good

time, Chapter I did well in the contest considering how few of us there were. Ralph won the Light Show and took second in the Bike Show, Rich says that is the last time now that he is back. Casey won 2nd in the Chapter Stick Race. Chris and Casey did a fantastic of making the stick, hope they remember to bring it to a meeting.

Today was warm and nice but the weatherman on Ch. 5 and friends at work say there is snow in the mountains, so it may be warm here but if you are venturing higher up, there may be snow on the roads. I heard there was snow near Fairplay Tuesday night.

The colder weather has made me think about getting the bike ready for winter. I don't usually do much as far as winterizing since we ride most of the winter, but after finding mice in the trunk in February, I decided to do a little research about winterizing bikes. PEP boys say: Oil change and check heating/cooling system, Brakes, Battery, Shocks & Struts. One 1800 website said put mothballs around and in the bike to keep the mice out (I hate the smell of mothballs), a better one sounded like the suggestion to put dryer sheets in trunk and inside the fairing to keep them out and not eat the wiring along with taping sandwich bags over the ends of the exhaust pipes. I still don't where there is a hole big enough for them to get in the trunk. The lesson I learned wasn't about cleaning up the mess they made but the two water bottles they chewed into that drained into the CB.

The real list for winterizing but with some oddities:

Check the battery and put it on a maintainer not a charger, if it is going get very cold take it out.

Put the bike on the centerstand and put carpet or plywood under the tires, flat spots??

Change the oil and filter

Check and top off the coolant and brake fluids

Fill the gas tank and put Sta-bil in the tank and run the motor for about 5 min. I read about 6 pages of articles about Sta-bil not working in gas with ethanol in it. The jury is still out on that one for me. Someone in Minnesota said to use Seafoam instead of Sta-bil.

Clean the bike and cover it with a loose fitting cover. A good coat of wax all over will help protect the finishes. A fellow from Canada suggests cleaning and coating everything with Lemon Pledge, first time I ever heard of that, although I do know it makes a car engine look really nice.

Air up the tires, they will probably loose about 2 psi per month. A fellow from Ohio said if you don't periodically check the tires and put the bike on the centerstand, you may find it leaning against your Acura in the morning. Wonder how he knows that.

Check the winter riding gear and electrics before you go out to ride.

Several members have had problems with front struts leaking, now might be good time check them.

And if you are forgetful like me, now is good time to do the Brake Recall if you haven't already.

P.S. The district still has cookbooks for sale, \$15 each, contact Nancy Lockhart or Don Cruzan. The money goes to help the Chapter COY program.


