
- From the Directors -







SNOWMOBILE TRIP

Snowmobile Rentals - I spoke to Nick at On the Trail Rentals today. He has set aside 20 single sleds and 4 doubles for our trip on **January 18-20**, **2013**. He has held them under my name so no one needs to make reservations at this time. At the December meeting, we will be asking for a commitment of the amount of time and the type of sled that you would like reserved in order to make certain that we have enough sleds reserved. You will need to call (On The Trail 888-627-2429) and put a reservation in your name on or after December 15th but no later than the first week of January in order to make certain that you have a sled reserved. On the Trail will take a credit card deposit of \$50 to apply towards the rental. Normally this deposit is non refundable but, with our group, Nick will work with us on any cancelations.

Currently, the cost is \$135 for 4 hours on a single and \$153 for 4 hours on a double - 2 hour rentals are available for \$90 for a single and \$110 for a double . The group will begin to ride at 12:30 and either ride until 2:30 or 4:30, depending on whether you chose to ride for 2 or 4 hours but all riders must be back by 4:30 in order to arrive back before dark. Everyone will need to arrive at On the Trail in Grand Lake for fittings and signup by 11:30 on the 18th.

Hotel Reservations - At the December meeting, an informational sheet will be distributed to determine who has made room reservations so we can double-check reservations and room types with hotel before our arrival.

This should be a great outing. Myra talked to the motel tonight and we already have 10 rooms reserved. (Gateway Inn 877-627-1352)

More info about other possible activities, meals, etc. will be distributed at the December and January meetings.
