Motorcycle Safety

Spring Riding Season is here! Are YOU prepared? How about your motorcycle?

Getting Prepared To Ride

Many motorcycle owners across the country are preparing to awaken their trusty steeds out of winter hibernation as warmer weather approaches. Here are

some inspection tips:

Remember T-CLOCK":

Tires and Wheels: Check tire pressure, check for dry rot or cracking sidewalls. How's the tread?

Controls: Levers, hoses, brake & throttle cables O.K?

Lights: Battery charged and lights work?
Oil: Fresh oils and levels good?
Chassis: Chain, suspension, chain/belt,

fasteners, accessories tight?

Kickstand: Center and side stand work?

Take It Easy The First Time Out

Remember, if you haven't been on your bike for a while, you should take it slow the first time out to re-energize your motorcycle muscle memory. Go to a parking lot to practice some of the basic skills of riding before heading out on the open road. Also, realize if you haven't been on your bike because of winter, all

of those car & truck drivers aren't used to seeing bikes on the road, so they are driving blind and you are invisible



Level I: <u>Safety by Commitment</u>- The first big step to success.

Level II: Safety by Education

Level III: Safety by Preparedness

Level IV: <u>Safety By Enhanced</u> <u>Commitment and Preparedness</u>



Motorcycle Safety Tips

In no particular order, here they are:

- 1) Make eye contact never assume others see you.
- Read "vehicle language" even when you're seen by drivers, cyclists and pedestrians, they often misjudge your distance/speed. Don't rely on them to make smart decisions.
- Watch out for left-turning vehicles at intersections – this is the most common type of motorcycle crash.
- 4) Check behind when turning left from a highway – check mirrors and make sure you have plenty of space behind you before you turn.
- 5) Look out for hazardous road conditions – wet roads, fluid spills, sand, gravel, railroad tracks, potholes and other road surface hazards reduce your traction.
- 6) Take it easy on the curves slow down and choose the correct lane position before entering a curve.
- 7) Wear a good helmet they prevent head injuries in 67% of crashes.
- 8) Wear protective clothing designed for riders – provides protection during a crash and shields you from the weather and debris.



- 9) Protect your eyes and face flying insects, dust and debris can injure your eyes and face. The best protection is a full-face helmet with shield (unless you like eating bugs).
- 10) Be visible wear bright, contrasting colored and reflective clothing....always keep your headlight on; consider adding auxiliary lights for extra visibility.

Motorcycle, ATV & 3-Wheeled vehicle riders are required to wear: Head Protection (a helmet, certified to meet Federal Motor Vehicle safety standards); Eye Protection (goggles, wrap around glasses or full face shield); Protective Clothing (wearing long sleeved shirt/jacket, long trousers, & full fingered gloves or mittens is required); Foot Protection (sturdy, over the ankle footwear that affords protection for the feet & ankles).

Two guys were roaring down the road on a motorcycle when the operator slowed down and pulled over. His leather jacket had a broken zipper, and he told his friend, "I can't ride with the air hitting me in the chest and this jacket flapping around." "Just put the jacket on backwards," his friend advised. So he did. They continued down the road but around the next bend, they lost control and wiped out. A nearby farmer came upon the accident. When the police arrived they asked the farmer, "Are they showing any signs of life?" "Well," the farmer explained, "this one was until I turned his head around the right way!"
