# MAY IS MOTORCYCLE AWARENESS MONTH

May marks the start of Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month when drivers of all other vehicles and all road users are reminded to safely "share the road" with motorcyclists, and to be extra alert to help keep motorcyclists safe.

On the other hand, it is imperative for all motorcycle riders to "gear up" and operate your bike with risk management being a priority.

CDOT partnered with a Denver production company to create the video (link below), which shows a time-lapse makeover to a rider to reveal what a crash survivor might look like if he hadn't worn gear. The video features Cody Carson, 25, an experienced rider who stated he doesn't always wear his safety gear. After make-up artist MaryAnn Hogan applied make-up to him re-enacting the outcome of a crash, he said, "But after seeing myself in the mirror made up with crash injuries, it was a reality check."

Remember be smart, dress the part, be alert and ride safe.



### **YUMMY RECIPES**

### **Compliments of Laurie Cruzan**

#### **SCOTCHEROOS**

- 1 c sugar 1 c white corn syrup
- 1 c peanut butter 7 c Rice Krispies
- 1 6oz choc chips 1 6oz butterscotch chips

Bring sugar and syrup to a rolling boil. Remove from heat and add peanut butter, mixing well.

And rice krispies then mix well. Pour in 9  $\times$  13 greased pan. Melt chips together and frost.

Let stand but cut before they get to hard.

1-2-3 cake!

You need two boxes of cake mix. One can be any flavor you prefer, but the other must be angel food cake mix, Mix them together(shake them in a big bowl). Then simply store the mixture in an airtight container until you get the urge for dessert. Then just put 3 Tbsp of the dry mixture in a big coffee mug and stir in 2 Tbsp of water. Microwave it for one minute and you will have a single serving of cake! Top with fruit, ice cream, whipped cream or whatever! Awesome for those of us who want something sweet every now and then without making an entire cake!

#### **FRENCH TOAST BAKE**

1/2 c melted butter 1 c brown sugar 1 loaf Texas toast

4 eggs 1 1/2 c milk 1 tsp vanilla

powdered sugar for sprinkling

Melt butter and mix with brown sugar. Stir until mixed! Pour butter/sugar mix into bottom of 9 x 13 pan. spread around. Beat eggs, milk, & vanilla together. Lay single layer of Texas toast in pan. Spoon 1/2 of egg mixture on bread layer. Add 2nd layer of Texas toast. Spoon on remaining egg mixture. Cover and chill in fridge overnight. Bake at 350 for 45 minutes( covered) for first 30 minutes). Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Serve with warm maple syrup!
