#### **RIDER EDUCATION**

### **NEVER ANTICIPATE THE COMMAND...**

Being in the military, I was always told not to anticipate the "Command of Execution." For those not in the military let me briefly

.

Before beginning with <u>marching</u>, <u>drilling</u>, or <u>facing</u> it is important to note the difference between a preparatory command and a command of execution. The preparatory of course 'prepares' you for what is to follow. It will tell you to pay attention to execute the command but it will typically also inform you as to what the command is. The command of execution generally is just there to signal when the command begins.

Take for example "Forward March". Forward is the preparatory command. You know that there is only one command that begins that way and you know what to do for Forward March. By the time the commands for "March" comes along you already know exactly what to do and you're ready to do it. That second command, the command of execution, only gives you the timing as to when to do it. That being said, it is different on a motorcycle. I will always want to anticipate what the action or motion of the person in the vehicle. Case in point...Laura and I were traveling back from Wing Ding 35, Westbound I-70 thru Kansas City, KS., when I saw a small pick-up pulling a boat enter the interstate. I was in the third lane or the hammer lane with no one behind me or ahead of me. The left shoulder was clear of vehicles but did have small debris. The middle lane had a car 3 or 4 car length ahead. The first lane had a car going not as fast as the rest of the group. The pick-up truck came on the interstate quite fast. He could not stay in the first lane; therefore he moved quickly the middle lane. Had he stopped there, things would have been fine. I anticipated the next move to be my lane, due to the fact it was clear. He never checked his mirrors or his blind spot. I kindly introduced him to the RIVCO 128 decimal air horns before he got comfortable in my lane. He swerve back to the middle lane and slowed down, Laura and I safely passed and he never look at us. He knew he was wrong because he never checked his surroundings.

I always try to anticipate the action of others either by the type of vehicles, time of day, day of the week, time of year, (summer, spring, and fall winter.). This gives me some type of indication of what driver I may encounter along the way. This may not work for all, but it is in my defensive arsenal of weapons.
