SAND...REALLY!!!

Sand, pebbles, gravel, grit, stones, dirt, slime, sludge, yuck, mud, crud, ooze, gook, gunk, soil, loam, clay, etc...Did I make my point.! Anything that does not belong on the road for a motorcycle rider will make us fall especially in a curve. You will know this, because my worst enemy and yours...GRAVITY, will take over.

We need to be careful in the curves. Expect to find debris there. Monday, one of our members went down on westbound Union toward Austin Bluffs. (Just west of Academy). This happen in the "S" curve portion of that street. Member was in the left lane in the left tire track and got too close to the edge where the gravel was and lost traction in the curve...you know the rest... GRAVITY. The majority of sand and debris is found on either side of the road. Stay away from the edge of the road in the curve. The Gold Wing...what a tuff machine. The engine guards protected the majority of the bike. A lot of cosmetic damage and pride was hurt. Safety gear works when worn properly. YES. Member had it on. Member rode the bike home and I followed. GOLD WING and SAFETY GEAR....what a GREAT TEAM!!!

TEAM RIDING

As Chapters in GWRRA, we, as a Chapter and or friends, do a lot of group riding from time to time. This is great, but we need to know how do it well and safely. GWRRA call this TEAM RIDING. This information can be found on the GWRRA web site under the SEARCH bar. (type in "Team Riding"). The reason that we have Team Riding is that everybody knows what to do, no matter the Region, District or Chapter. There are a lot of topics in the manual, but I'm going to focus on just a few topics. Please refer to the manual for more detailed information.

A good team ride is planned from the beginning, with destination and routes to and from. Most of our rides are day rides or shorter. Everybody still needs to know the route and pit stops. Maps may be outdated due to phones with maps. Decide on Lead and Drag bikes. Discuss the speed of travel, routes, first time bikers, first time lead riders, pit stops, photo opportunities, meals and breaks.

Do TCLOC on your bike before you move out. Everybody should come with a full tank of fuel. Everybody should have appropriate gear for the weather. Carry rain gear for inclement weather. Memorize the Group Riding Hand Signals and assist those bikes that do not have C.B. radio. These hand signals are universal. Hand signals are also found in the back of the Gold Book.

We, GWRRA, ride as a group of 5-7 in a group. It has be found to be safer to manage a group of that size. Have you ever tried to pass a group of 25 motorcycles? That could be an accident waiting to happen. Each group should have a Lead and Drag bike, both equipped with working C.B. radio. Their responsibility is to communicate, coordinate and maneuver the team in formation safely through traffic, as a unit. The Drag and the Lead have joint responsibility for the safety of the team and safe conduct of the ride.

A GOOD TEAM MEMBER...Assumes a responsibility to ride with and work with the other team members for the safety and protection of the whole team while on the road, and especially, while in traffic. They should maintain steady speed and spacing. Yo-Yoing or straggling behind disrupts the rhythm and efforts of the other team members, and reduces the benefits of riding as a team. Stays alert and announces to the other team members any obstacle, condition or potential situation which could

become hazardous to the team or team member. They also will be aware of the other team members and maintain the formation (staggered) and a safe riding distance (spacing) between team members. Spacing will be determined by the road, weather conditions, and visibility. They will not leave "holes" in the formation to invite aggressive motorist into the formation which results in tailgating our teammate.


Again, I refer you to the GWRRA site and in the SEARCH BAR type in "Team Riding". There is a lot more information than what I have mention here. It will give more details and pictures.

Finally, an important part of any team ride is consideration. Have consideration for all members of all teams. Always give consideration to the other vehicles on the road. Even more important, have consideration for your own safety and the team. Have consideration for your own capabilities, skills, health, physical fitness, and feelings. Never drive beyond your comfort level! Enjoy your Team Riding...and be careful!




District Rally 2015 Chapter Cowboy Hat Challenge Rules and Information


