#### **RIDER EDUCATION LEVELS PROGRAM**

Do you know the first step to starting up the Rider Levels

Program?

It begins with a simple and important commitment...

#### Level 1—"SAFETY BY COMMITMENT"

This is achieved simply by making a commitment to ride safely.

#### Level 2—"SAFETY BY EDUCATION"

This is achieved with addition of : -Taking an ERC –Experienced Rider Course, ARC—Advance Rider Course, or TRC—Trike Rider Course -5000 miles of safe riding (Safe riding is defined as having no accidents.)

#### Level 3—"SAFETY BY PREPAREDNESS"

-Must currently be at Level 2 in the Rider Ed Program -First Aid and CPR Training -Motorist Awareness Seminar [one-time] -Carry First Aid Kit on bike

#### Level 4—"SAFETY BY ENHANCED PREPAREDNESS AND EXPERIENCE"

-Current Level 3 for one year -Current First Aid and CPR -25,000 Safe miles -Completed Rider Training course within the past year -Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.

#### Level 4— "SENIOR MASTER—Level 4 for Five years

Level 4— "GRAND MASTER— Level 4 for Ten years

#### Level 4—"LIFE GRAND MASTER — Level 4 for Fifteen years

#### **RIDER EDUCATION LEVELS PROGRAM**

Patches, pins, and other dangly things are available as each stage is attained.

There is also a HIGH MILEAGE Program. To be eligible, you must have accumulated 50,000 miles and have this validated by any GWRRA Officer.

Talk with your Chapter Rider Educator to get signed up, if you haven't yet, and to ask about Rider Courses and CPR/First Aid and any other rider education questions.






2006 GOLD WING TRIKE \$17,000


